YOUNG PEOPLE!

I am always hoping and praying for more young people to be engaged with their faith and involved in parish life. I know I am not alone in this. Equally, I am well aware of my inadequacy, my inability to make this happen. Again, this frustration may well be the experience of the adult members of our parish.

Thankfully, there are people close at hand who are gifted in working with young people. Sue Longhurst is the Catholic Youth Ministry Coordinator for Bromley Deanery and over the last few years she has been encouraging young people to become involved in various initiatives which help them live out their Catholic faith more fruitfully. With the help of other adults Sue has made the CYM programme an effective instrument in helping young people believe they are valued and have a role to play in the Church.

One of the recent initiatives is the launch of the **Deanery Youth Council**. In a recent email to me and the priests of this parish Sue explained, 'The aim of the Youth Council is to give our older youth an opportunity to guide and shape the youth ministry events and initiatives going forward and to represent the needs of the young people in their respective parishes. It will provide them with an opportunity to gain experience as youth councillors, to engage in training to develop key leadership skills and to socialise with others from all over the deanery'.

There will also be an opportunity to get involved with bigger projects such as youth pilgrimages to Taize or the Camino de Santiago Compostela.
