# COME, LORD JESUS, COME!

"Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come." These are the sobering words of Jesus in the Gospel for this first Sunday of Advent. Essentially Jesus is saying, 'As you do not know when I will return, be steadfast in your vigilance.'

The first two Sundays of Advent concentrate on the second coming of our Lord and the last two, the first coming, the Incarnation. So, in a sense, we are looking forward with faith and looking back in a spirit of thanksgiving.

Being watchful for the Day of the Lord is all about being ready, and we prepare ourselves by nourishing our souls with the Mass, the scriptures, the sacraments, our prayers and our selfless good deeds.

However, although we wait and watch for this momentous return, it doesn't mean Jesus is absent from our everyday lives; he comes to us in many ways, through people, nature, prayers, dreams and so many of the events and experiences we have in our lifetime.

Have you ever thought of yourself as a contemplative? Henri Nouwen, a Dutch Catholic priest, writer and theologian (1932-1996) believed we are called to be contemplatives, see-ers who see the coming of God in our everyday world. It's a constant action going on around us, between us and within us. But he warns us to be aware of the obstacles and blindfolds that would prevent us from recognising and benefitting from his extra-ordinary presence. Can you think what they might be?

Perhaps during this first part of Advent we can focus on eradicating anything that would prevent us from experiencing his loving presence.

Here is a prayer that can be a plea to our Lord for the here and now and for when he finally comes at the end of time. "Oh! Yes, Lord Jesus, come and reign! Let my body be your Temple, my heart be your throne, my will be your devoted servant; let me be yours forever, living only of you and for you."
