ST PAUL'S LIFE & MINISTRY & THE DEMANDS OF OUR VOCATION

The saints occupy an important place in our journey of discipleship as the example of their lives provides us with inspiration to persevere in our Christian vocation. Each saint has something unique to teach us and as we reflect on their lives we come to a better understanding of the demands of our vocation. This is very true of St Paul whose conversion we celebrate this week. Paul was initially opposed to the gospel and persecuted Christians. But following his dramatic conversion Paul became God's instrument for the propagation of the same gospel he had tried to destroy.

What is clear from Paul's life and ministry is that God can use anyone or anything for his purpose. So long as we yield ourselves completely to him we are sure to be effective in his hands, regardless of what our past has been. What is required is that we be converted from our former ways and resolve to walk in the path of righteousness. Once Paul had been converted he applied all his zeal and resources to the propagation of the Christian gospel. As he says famously in reference to his complete abandonment to divine grace. "because of the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, I count everything else as loss. For him I have accepted the loss of all other things and look on them all as filth if only I can gain Christ and be given a place in him." (Phil.3:7-9)

Paul's statement tells us just how much he surrendered himself to Jesus once he had encountered him, so that it is not surprising that he was so effective as an evangelizer since it was Christ that was at work in him in the power of the Holy Spirit from start to finish. It cannot be over-emphasized that if we are to be effective witnesses of Christ in our times we too must conversion encounter him and undergo a experience that will lead us to yield ourselves completely to Christ. The more we surrender our lives to Christ, the more his grace becomes effective in us in bringing others to him. May St Paul obtain for us the grace to turn our lives completely to God and be an instrument of peace and unity in our family and the society at large in this Octave of Christian Unity and beyond!
