“O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human.”

So says the Easter Proclamation, or Exsultet, which is chanted at the beginning of the Easter Vigil, in the darkened church. I have spent a lot of time with this magnificent prayer in recent weeks and I have found its riches to be truly inexhaustible. No other prayer tells the entire salvation history of the Church whilst expressing how the New and Old Testament form one seamless whole. At the heart of Easter, the greatest celebration in the Christian calendar, is the mystery of this union of heaven and earth. Easter is truly a marriage, Christ is joined to his Church and we, the people, are cleaved to God. Cleave has two contradictory meanings, to join and to separate. The sin of Adam separated us from God; but the sacrifice of Christ joins us to God, divine and human are brought together as they were in the body of Christ. Throughout the Passion we see glimpses of Christ's human frailty, as the burden of His impending suffering seems too great to bear. And yet, He endures so as to win our salvation. Christ is fully human and fully God and in this marriage of His two natures heaven and earth are brought together.

In the Easter Vigil this marriage is most powerfully symbolised by the reception of new Catholics into our community. The 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' (RCIA) reaches a climax at Easter, as around the world those who have heard and responded to God's call embrace their new life in Christ. In Beckenham we welcome our 3 catechumens and 3 candidates as they embrace the divine in their lives on this truly blessed night. It is a moment for us all to reflect on the incredible gift with which we have been blessed, the divine spark within each of us is rekindled by the light of Christ.

If Easter represents the marriage between Christ and His church what does that mean for each of us? Marriage is built on the found-

ations of commitment, fidelity, honesty and communication. Our relationship with Christ calls us to to commit to him exclusively and wholeheartedly, to be honest, especially when addressing our failings, and to speak and listen to Him, through prayer. So, this Easter let us seize the opportunity to strengthen our commitment to Christ, to build a loving relationship with Him, so that we can renew the face of the earth.

### Mary's Meals

Mary's Meals serves nutritious school meals to children living in some of the world's poorest countries. The promise of a good meal attracts these hungry children into the classroom, giving them the energy to learn and hope for a better future.

By providing a daily meal at school, Mary's Meals creates a fundamental change in the lives of children who don't have enough to eat and provides hope for today and tomorrow. This hope feels even more important when these children are growing up in war zones and places of conflict, as many in these programme countries are.

Mary's Meals can provide a meal for just 10p (thanks to the work of many thousands of volunteer cooks and their experience in sourcing locally procured food in bulk), meaning that a child can be fed for a whole school year for £19.15.

Fr Steve has asked that Mary's Meals is our charity for Maundy Thursday.


