WHY DID AN AMERICAN PRIEST HAVE TO BE BAPTISED AND RE-ORDAINED Who can baptise?

- I have my Irish great-grandmother's prayer book printed in 1912. Very near the start it states, "Provided an infant is in danger of dying before a priest can be procured, any other person, whether man, woman or child may baptize it in the following manner: Whilst pouring ordinary water on the head or face of the infant pronounce the words "I baptize thee in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost". Of course, in those days midwives were often given instruction on how to perform an emergency lay baptism. To which I should add the following.
- 1) Canon Law states that the ordinary minister of baptism is a deacon or priest. The Church teaches us both that the sacrament of baptism cannot be repeated and that it is the essential to allow us to receive the other sacraments, such as marriage or confirmation. So if a child received an emergency baptism, these days we are quite likely to do a conditional baptism to make sure. The deacon or priest says, "Fred, if you are not already baptised, I baptise you......". We also do this when someone asks for a sacrament but cannot find proof of their baptism. This was the case earlier this year in my last parish of a lady in her 50s who had not been confirmed as a child and now wished to be confirmed.
- 2) Provided the baptism is done in the name of the Trinity, using the words Jesus gave us (Matthew 28:19), and by pouring **water** (no other liquid will do!) we therefore recognise the baptisms of most Protestant denominations, e.g. Church of England. If a person has been baptised in this way they become Catholic by publicly professing their faith and being confirmed.
- 3) However, there are denominations who do not believe in the Trinity, or baptise "in Jesus' name," or use the words Father, Son and Holy Spirit but do not understand the Trinity as we do e.g. the Mormons. In this case the person has never been validly baptised and must therefore receive a valid Catholic baptism.
- 3) The exact words and method must be used. Recently a young American priest, Fr Matthew Hood, was watching a video of his baptism in 1990. He was horrified to realise that the deacon who 'baptised" him had used the words "We baptise you...." instead of the correct ones. Hisinvalid baptism in domino-like fashion, erased his other sacraments and meant that he wasn't really a priest." That's why I am not encouraging you to have "do it yourself" baptisms, the consequences of messing up are too serious!
- 4) As for controversies over the amount of water to use the answer is in a early Christian document called the Didache, dated to AD 100 or earlier. It insists on thorough preparation including teaching, fasting and prayer and the Trinitarian formula. As for the amount of water it just says that if you don't have a river to use, "baptise in some other water. If you cannot in cold, then in warm. If you have neither, then pour water on the head three times in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit." As Syria is a desert country I doubt they had lots of rivers to use for baptisms, and pouring on the head was probably the most common way, just like today. If someone tells you that you have to be baptised again "properly" by being completely dunked three times in the Thames, or even a pool, just say politely that you can only be baptised once.
