## THE LETTER - a Postcript

On 17<sup>th</sup> September St Edmund's hosted a successful screening of the documentary The Letter in the church hall as part of the Season of Creation. The film follows five people representing groups that are most affected by the climate crisis as they travel from their home countries to meet with Pope Francis in the Vatican to share their stories with him. The film was made in response to the papal encyclical (or 'letter' - hence the title) Laudato Si' (Praised Be) which was subsequently expanded upon in his exhortation Laudate Deum (Praise God). This film powerfully brings home the human scale consequences of climate change, which

## **REMEMBRANCE DAY 2024**


We will be displaying our swathe of poppies in the church again during November.
