These emails impersonate Fr Steve, often using a similar email name and masking the real email address. They typically request the recipient to purchase Amazon or other gift cards as gifts for the priest. Unfortunately, there have been reports of parishioners in some parishes falling victim to these scams, with some individuals losing up to £600 to the fraudsters. We have been asked by the diocesan ICT department to spread awareness of these emails and what to look our for: Never purchase gift cards as gifts for the priests based on an email request, unless you have verified the request directly in person or through a trusted means. Double-check any suspicious email by directly contacting the parish office. Avoid sharing personal or financial information in response to unsolicited emails. If you encounter any of these emails, please report them as spam and inform the parish office immediately.
