

### ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL - ARCHBISHOP JOHN WILSON SPEAKS OUT

As the assisted suicide bill was published this week, our Archbishop John Wilson has urged people to act and raise their voices in opposition to the proposals.

Archbishop John said the threat is "not just physical but moral and spiritual too. We are duty bound to stand up and challenge this attack on human dignity on all fronts".

The Archbishop makes clear that if "we are true followers of Christ, we must do all we can to support and protect the most vulnerable in our society".

In his message, posted on YouTube and other social media channels, the Archbishop highlights the pressure the proposals will put people suffering illnesses or disabilities under. He said: "People are being presented as a problem. As a burden. A statistic. Something we can deal with through ending their life".

Archbishop John asks "where is the dignity in that? Where is the love in that?" Each person is made in the image and likeness of God. We are called, the Archbishop said, as followers of the Lord Jesus to "care for those who are suffering, not to bring about their death". Because, "who are we to say a life is not worth living or that someone is better off dead because society values their contribution less than someone else".

This is why, Archbishop John said, "we need to raise our voices to say that is not true". He urges everyone to "speak up", because "if we don't stand up and value the dignity of human life, who will?"

Because as Archbishop John said, "as followers of the Lord Jesus, we must be bold in our efforts to uphold, respect and protect every human life from conception until natural death".

So please show, that "you will not sit idly while the elderly and people with illnesses and disabilities are treated as nothing but a burden to society and their family".

Together, let's be clear all are made in the likeness and image of God. That they are loved.

During the November meeting of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, the bishops will gather for a Holy Hour to pray for the promotion of the dignity of the human person and the culture of life in England and Wales.

This comes in response to the assisted suicide legislation currently before the UK Parliament. The Bishops' Holy Hour will start at **5.30 pm on Wednesday 13 November.** 

Parishes, religious houses, and other institutions within Southwark archdiocese, as well as those in other dioceses across England and Wales, have been invited to arrange Holy Hours at the same time, so as to be united with the bishops in a powerful moment of prayer, that the intrinsic dignity of every person be respected.

#### THE LETTER - a Postcript

On 17<sup>th</sup> September St Edmund's hosted a successful screening of the documentary The Letter in the church hall as part of the Season of Creation. The film follows five people representing groups that are most affected by the climate crisis as they travel from their home countries to meet with Pope Francis in the Vatican to share their stories with him. The film was made in response to the papal encyclical (or 'letter' - hence the title) Laudato Si' (Praised Be) which was subsequently expanded upon in his exhortation Laudate Deum (Praise God). This film powerfully brings home the human scale consequences of climate change, which

#### THE ASSISTED DYING BILL

Last week Cardinal Vincent Nichols wrote a letter asking us to oppose this bill as our own Archbishop, John Wilson, did earlier in the year. As ever, the proponents of the bill use the language of "choice", "rights" and "dignity" to make the unacceptable appear acceptable. The Cardinal makes three points:

#### 1. Be careful of what you wish for.

The experience of countries that have already introduced similar legislation, such as Canada and Belgium, shows that "The circumstances in which taking a life is permitted are widened and widened." The Catholic Herald recently reported that "In 2022 a 23-year-old woman opted, and was allowed, to be euthanized due to suffering PTSD following an ISIS terror attack in Brussels airport in 2016." It commented, "Does that sound like care for a terminally ill individual with a physical condition that is causing chronic pain?" As the Cardinal says, "It is a journey best not begun."

#### 2. A "right" to die becomes a duty to die.

In these countries palliative care is becoming increasingly restricted and it is reasonable to expect the same would happen here. Ironically, this so called extension of choice would produce an intolerable situation where only the wealthiest would be able to afford the end of life care they need the Cardinal makes it clear that these days excellent pain relief is available - whilst our relationship with medical staff would be damaged for ever. Needless to say it is to be feared that people would be put under pressure "to do the right thing" by those seeking to receive their inheritance. It would be much better to keep things as they are and to improve palliative care.

#### 3. Being forgetful of God belittles our humanity.

Our faith teaches that every human being - made in the image and likeness of God- has an inherent dignity and worth. Our humanity was embraced by Jesus Christ who "Brings our humanity to its full glory through the gateway of suffering and death." 



After a few days, the time came for him to leave, but there was one last meal in the refectory when anybody was free to ask the holy man any questions. One of the young monks could contain himself no longer:

"Father, you have been here for a while now and have carefully observed everything. Tell me, who is the holiest person in our monastery?"

The holy man paused for a moment and then said, *"Nicholas, the lay brother who is* the cook, beyond any doubt." Perplexed, the monks started to protest: "Surely this cannot be right. He swears, he loses his temper and quarrels, and he is far too fond of drink. And he can't sing the liturgy properly in the chapel as he can't read the words or the music!"

The holy man sighed and said, "You should know that God does not see as man sees for He knows all things and all secrets. This man has come a long way in the spiritual life. What you say is true, but if you knew what a terrible childhood and upbringing Nicholas had, and how he suffered before coming to the monastery, you would see how much he loves God and the depth of his gratitude."



## THE WINNER TAKES IT ALL?

As we approach the end of an exciting, and uplifting, Olympic Games from Paris - an event that has also caused some controversy ----I think it's appropriate to reflect on what the games mean to us as Catholics. Even from their origins in 776 BC the games were a political tool for each Greek city state to assert its supremacy over its neighbour. In modern times cities invest fortunes first to try and win the right to host the games, and then spend even more if they are successful to build ever more impressive facilities. Sadly, the legacy left behind

often falls into disrepair, Brazil spent \$13.5bn dollars on the Rio games. At the same time nearly a quarter of Brazilians live in poverty and yet many of the Olympic venues of 2016 remain empty 8 years after the games. So, what are the games for? Are they more than a marketing tool for attracting tourists to a 'spruced-up' city?

Are the Olympics just a vehicle for boasting about our sporting prowess compared to the rest of the world? I must admit that I look to the medal table and feel some national pride as we 'punch above our weight' against larger nations. But I have been particularly touched by the reactions of athletes who have not experienced the success that they hoped, and worked, so hard for, or even the expectations that the media have placed upon them. After missing out on a medal British diver Andrea Spendolini-Siriex said: "I'm so happy to be here, to be at the Olympic Games. It's been a really long year and it doesn't take away from my accomplishments. Just missing out on one medal doesn't change who I am. It was just God's way of saying there is more to do and I just give God all the glory."



Here is a young woman who could be an example to us all; it's so easy to become wrapped up in our accomplishments and to lose sight of the gifts that we receive from God that make everything in our lives possible.

In Paris 37 athletes are competing as part of the **IOC** Refugee Olympic Team, representing more 100 million forcibly than displaced people. As Britain into a febrile descends summer of rioting, fuelled by misinformation from the far right there is no better time remember that to the modern Olympics were

intended to create a better world, by bringing people together through sport practiced without discrimination and in the Olympic spirit, which is based on mutual understanding, friendship, solidarity and fair play. And in these virtues, we can see a reflection of the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, which is itself built on the Gospels.

Although the Olympics finish on Sunday the sport continues from 28<sup>th</sup> August with the start of the Paralympics. Channel 4 has become synonymous with the Paralympic coverage in the UK and this year has set out to eliminate patronising attitudes towards these athletes, with its campaign: *Considering what?* The intention is to present these Paralympians as elite, world-class athletes in their own right rather than as people 'overcoming' disabilities. This shift in perception is vitally important as we celebrate the dignity of **all** human beings, as the Gospel calls us to.

Please pray for all the athletes at the Olympics and Paralympics, for their families, and their supporters, whether they have 'won' or 'lost'.

## IT'S WHAT YOU MAKE OF IT

There was once a monk called Nicholas who spent a long time wondering about heaven and hell, searching the scriptures to find out. One evening as he was saying his prayers, the Lord sent him an angel who said, "Nicholas, the Lord has sent me to tell you that He has granted you a favour. He has instructed me to take you to heaven and hell in a vision so you may know the truth in this matter."

## EL CAMINO DE SANTIAGO (ST JAMES' WAY)

The Camino is a metaphor for life. You start alone, gradually people join you, and each of these people brings something into your life and helps you grow as a person.

The Camino is as amazing as life itself. It is full of beauty, but there are stretches that are unpleasant, steep, difficult to conquer, and you think it will continue like that until the end, but no, soon you will find the beauty, calm and joy of continuing walking. Little by little you come to realize that everything is cyclical and that it doesn't matter if there are stretches that you don't like, that challenge you, sooner or later they will end and you will have other stretches of peace, joy and beauty; sometimes even during these peaceful stretches there are parts that are not so alluring but they do not take away your inner peace.

I have learned that stumbles along the way are necessary. They are a reminder to be present in the moment and not to go through life automatically. Stumbles are there to remind you that we have to live and enjoy every moment of the journey, not just the beautiful parts.

I have also learned that shortcuts are not always shorter or better paths - they are simply options that arise and, regardless of what we choose, we will continue on our path.

The Camino has taught me to appreciate the simple things in life, the beauty of nature, the kindness of strangers, the joy of companionship and patience. It has shown me that happiness is not found in material possessions, but in the connections we make and the experiences we have.

The Camino is a journey of self-discovery, a test of endurance, and a lesson in humility. It has changed me in ways I never thought possible and I will carry with me the lessons I have learned for the rest of my life.

#### WHY DID AN AMERICAN PRIEST HAVE TO BE BAPTISED AND RE-ORDAINED Who can baptise?

I have my Irish great-grandmother's prayer book printed in 1912. Very near the start it states, "Provided an infant is in danger of dying before a priest can be procured, any other person, whether man, woman or child may baptize it in the following manner: Whilst pouring ordinary water on the head or face of the infant pronounce the words "I baptize thee in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost". Of course, in those days midwives were often given instruction on how to perform an emergency lay baptism. To which I should add the following.

1) Canon Law states that the ordinary minister of baptism is a deacon or priest. The Church teaches us both that the sacrament of baptism cannot be repeated and that it is the essential to allow us to receive the other sacraments, such as marriage or confirmation. So if a child received an emergency baptism, these days we are quite likely to do a conditional baptism to make sure. The deacon or priest says, "Fred, if you are not already baptised, I baptise you......". We also do this when someone asks for a sacrament but cannot find proof of their baptism. This was the case earlier this year in my last parish of a lady in her 50s who had not been confirmed as a child and now wished to be confirmed.

2) Provided the baptism is done in the name of the Trinity, using the words Jesus gave us (Matthew 28:19), and by pouring **water** (no other liquid will do!) we therefore recognise the baptisms of most Protestant denominations, e.g. Church of England. If a person has been baptised in this way they become Catholic by publicly professing their faith and being confirmed.

3) However, there are denominations who do not believe in the Trinity, or baptise "*in Jesus' name*," or use the words Father, Son and Holy Spirit but do not understand the Trinity as we do e.g. the Mormons. In this case the person has never been validly baptised and must therefore receive a valid Catholic baptism.

3) The exact words and method must be used. Recently a young American priest, Fr Matthew Hood, was watching a video of his baptism in 1990. He was horrified to realise that the deacon who 'baptised" him had used the words "We baptise you...." instead of the correct ones. His-invalid baptism in domino-like fashion, erased his other sacraments and meant that he wasn't really a priest." That's why I am not encouraging you to have "do it yourself" baptisms, the consequences of messing up are too serious!

4) As for controversies over the amount of water to use the answer is in a early Christian document called the Didache, dated to AD 100 or earlier. It insists on *thorough preparation including teaching, fasting and prayer* and the Trinitarian formula. As for the amount of water it just says that if you don't have a river to use, *"baptise in some other water. If you cannot in cold, then in warm. If you have neither, then pour water on the head three times in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit."* As Syria is a desert country I doubt they had lots of rivers to use for baptisms, and pouring on the head was probably the most common way, just like today. If someone tells you that you have to be baptised again "properly" by being completely dunked three times in the Thames, or even a pool, just say politely that you can only be baptised once.





## QUESTIONS FOR FR ANDREW

## Why do Catholic bibles have more books than Protestant ones?

Sometimes you will hear the accusation that we have added books. We might answer that our Protestant brethren *have taken books out.* The first thing to say is that the New Testament is the same for both Catholics and Protestants. Martin Luther considered Revelations to be unworthy and argued that the Letter of James should be excluded. James says *"Faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."* (James 2:17.) This contradicted Luther's new doctrine of *Salvation by Faith Alone* that he had worked out from reading St Paul's letters. It is a good example of why we should not use a verse or a passage out of context, without considering other relevant bits of the Bible. (Jehovah's Witnesses, I'm thinking of you). In the end Luther did not get his way in excluding these books as his fellow Protestants did not wish to overturn the traditional list.

As for the Old Testament, the list of books we and Orthodox Christians use is essentially that of the Septuagint, (translation of the "Seventy" in Greek). The tradition is that seventy translators translated the Hebrew to Greek. This was done in the centuries before Christ was born because Greek speaking Jews in Alexandria and elsewhere no longer understood Hebrew.

The common language of the earliest Christians was Greek, the New Testament was written in it and the Old Testament quotations in it are naturally taken from the Septuagint. The Greek Church Fathers carried on using the Septuagint and basically we and the Orthodox still have the same list of books in our Old Testament.

For us Catholics the list was defined by the Council of Trent in 1546 in response to Protestant criticisms, but it was only endorsing a list that had been accepted for centuries. Martin Luther argued that the Old Testament should only include the narrower lists of books adopted by the Jews after the destruction of the Temple in AD 70. Of course it just happened that the narrower list removed the Biblical justification for certain Catholic practices that Luther disliked, such as the intercession of angels (Tobit) and prayers for the dead. (2 Maccabees 12:46.) These and other books not in the Hebrew Bible are sometimes printed as the Apocrypha in Protestant Bibles.

In short Catholic Bibles contain all the books that were considered inspired by the earliest Christians and nothing has been added.

 The Permanent Diaconate was reinstated nearly 60 years ago by Pope Paul VI. as one

nearly 60 years ago by Pope Paul VI, as one of the three orders of ordained ministry in the Church, alongside bishops and priests. Deacons have been part of our clergy for most of my life and yet our Deacons remain relatively few in number, while the distribution of those Deacons across our Church varies enormously. We have been fortunate in our parish, and in our deanery, to have enjoyed a rich and diverse diaconal ministry over many years. Archbishop John greatly values this Diaconal Ministry and has a dream that there will be, before he retires, a Deacon in all 179 parishes across our archdiocese. This is why Archbishop John has instituted the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, this weekend, as a Diaconate Day. This weekend (and hopefully for years to come) you will see promotional material about vocations to the diaconate across the archdiocese and, we hope, many Deacons and Priests addressing diaconal ministry in their homilies.

Deacons were a vital part of the church from its earliest days, the first seven men chosen by the congregation are named in Acts 6:1-15, "seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom". It is a job description without equal, and deeply humbling, but modern Deacons continue to answer the call, to volunteer their time, and their talents. Many are married and most rely on secular jobs to support their families (who must come first), in addition to giving their time to ministry.

The process of discernment and formation is long, taking 5-6 years from initial enquiry, and can be arduous, requiring academic study and spiritual and pastoral development, but the spiritual rewards are beyond measure.

## **QUESTIONS FOR FR ANDREW**

Some weeks ago several parishioners came to me with roughly the same questions about the day's readings. So, I have decided to invite you to ask me questions and I will try to reply. You can ask me in person, leave them on paper, or email me.

#### Question 1 Why are we getting a new translation of the Bible to use at Mass?

It is over 10 years since we had a new translation of the Mass and the simple answer is that it was felt we should have one that matches it. In the 1960s the theory behind the translations, of the Mass or the Bible, was to get across the idea in a way that is easily understandable to modern people. Think of the old translation, "God of power and might." Whilst this is not difficult to understand, we have gone back to the more literal "Lord God of hosts." Why? The literal translation has a richness of meaning that was not obvious before. Host means army and it recalls that the Israelites literally went into battle with the Ark of the Covenant. The Lord was the commander of His army. It has also traditionally been seen as a reference to the "hosts of heaven." Remember the Christmas story, Luke 2:13, where the phrase "heavenly host" is used to mean the angels.

The new ESV Bible version is a bit more literal and a revision of the RSV. So, we shall once more hear readings such as "Blessed are the poor in spirit" (Matthew 5:3) rather than the "Happy" of the Jerusalem Bible. The ESV uses inclusive language where none of the richness of the original text is missed, and where it makes the text sound more natural to our modern ears. However, in other cases in sticks to traditional translations such as "Son of Man." Quite a few modern translations render this, where it occurs in the Old Testament, as "human being," but Jesus frequently uses the phrase of Himself, and it was thought the traditional translation should be retained for the reader to be aware of the resonance. Similarly, when Luke 2:7 says that "Mary brought forth her first born son" it would be wrong to translate son as child because the first born son is a term used in Jewish Law. He, as "son and heir," has a privileged position. Luke is not implying there were other later born sons, just that Jesus has this special position, even though He is the only son. Of course, it does imply that clergy and catechists have a duty to explain these translation choices so that the implications are clear.

That said, I would encourage you to carry on reading your Bibles in whatever version you have and prefer!

## A REMINDER ABOUT MARRIAGE PREPARATION

In our diocese couples wanting to marry in church must contact the parish priest **six months** ahead of their intended wedding date. This is to allow sufficient time for them to attend the Marriage Preparation Course but also to allow enough time for all the necessary paperwork to be completed.

Our priests prefer to be given a year to complete the paperwork and suggest that couples do not set a date for their wedding until they have first spoken to a priest.

Once you have decided to get married please email the Parish Office and a preliminary marriage application form will be sent to you.

#### If you intend to get married at a church other than St Edmund's, or overseas, the clergy at St Edmund's is still responsible for all the paperwork.

For parishioners born outside the UK we need to obtain documentation from their previous parishes. This can take some time.

There is also extra work to be completed for those who are having their ceremony abroad or for those who have had a previous marriage. So, in short, as soon as you decide to get married, please start the ball rolling by getting in touch with us.

#### SAINTS FOR OUR TIMES

Last weekend 39 of our younger parishioners were confirmed by Bishop Philip Moger. They are the future of our Church and yet Confirmantion is often described as the "sacrament of exit". The Catechists pray that these bright and talented young people will continue to grow in their faith and become the saints we know they can be.

At the beginning of the Confirmation course, we introduced these young people to some of the saints that they might find inspirational in modelling their own lives. At the time we introduced our candidates to Carlo Acutis, who was declared 'Blessed' in October 2020.

Carlo was born in London to Italian parents in 1991, and from an early age he displayed a particular affinity for the Church and especially for the Eucharist. At 12 years old he became a catechist in the parish youth group of Santa Maria Segreta in Milan. His computer skills were recognised around this time, and he built websites for the parish and also to promote volunteering at his high school. Carlo tragically and suddenly died at the age of just 15 from leukaemia, but he left a remarkable legacy, a website documenting Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions recognised by the Church, which can be found at:

In May this year Pope Francis acknowledged a second miracle accredited to prayers to Blessed Carlo; this opens the door for Carlo Acutis to be canonised in 2025, as the first millennial saint. This is a most significant event for the Church in the Third Millennium but also for our young people; to discover a saint who relates so closely to their lives.

St Augustine's catholic church in Tunbridge Wells is currently hosting until the 30<sup>th</sup> June The Blessed Carlo Acutis International Eucharistic Miracle Exhibition and a talk is being delivered about this remarkable young man by Gavin Ashenden, Associate Editor of the Catholic Herald, on the evening of the 19<sup>th</sup> June. I would encourage you to visit the exhibition, or to attend the talk if you can, to find out more about this blessed and holy young man.



## NEW LECTIONARY TO BE LAUNCHED IN ENGLAND AND WALES FOR ADVENT 2024

The Lectionary is a book which contains the readings for Mass (Sundays and Weekdays), for Saints and Sacraments, and other occasions, such as funerals. It is the big book on the ambo in our churches and it comes in four large volumes.

The Lectionary is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued to work through all the other liturgical rites. The changes are intended to make biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, using better, more up-to-date biblical scholarship and a text which is more pro-claimable.

#### How much will the Lectionaries we use in the church cost?

The 4-volume Lectionary will be available in three sizes: a full-size Ambo Edition (£695) for our churches, a smaller Chapel Edition (£395) for use in small chapels, and a Study Edition (£250) that is needed by priests and the parish office for liturgy and homily preparation. This represents an unavoidable cost for both the parish and our clergy, and orders must be placed by 30 June to have them in time for the first Sunday of Advent when they come into use at the start of the church's year.

# SAY YES TO MARY

My wife and I travelled last week to Medjugorje with 24 other pilgrims. Everything in Medjugorje flows from the visions of Our Lady who, it is claimed, first appeared to the six children (as they were then), in 1981 and continue to this day. This once obscure village in southern Bosnia is Europe's third most visited apparition site: under the control of the Vatican but with no official verdict on the veracity of the visions.

It's hard to describe the feeling of love and holiness which envelopes this place which overflows with God's grace and with the devotion of the residents and pilgrims. It would be easy to be sceptical about the visions (I certainly have been in the past), which it is claimed still occur for three of the visionaries at 5.40 pm every day; when the Church bells

chime and everyone pauses whatever they are doing. The fruits of Medjugorje are difficult to ignore and the testimonies of those whose lives have been transformed are extraordinarily his daily climb to the top of the mountain with powerful. We were blessed during our pilgrimage to be supported by a local guide, who spoke from the heart about her experiences and their impact on her life. She was an eloquent ambassador for her birthplace and for the devotion to Our Lady that the apparitions have generated. We later discovered that she is related to one of the visionaries. In the church of St James Mass is held in many different languages and the thunderous responses and fully engaged congregation are something that I have not experienced before. From 5pm every day pilgrims queue to make their Confession, face to face, in the open air in multiple languages.

Early on Tuesday morning we reached the top of Križevac (or Cross) mountain with our fellow pilgrims, having followed a most prayerful stations of the cross. We stood at the foot of the cross, just as Our Lady stood at the foot of the true cross, a relic of which is buried within the concrete cross itself. It's easy to feel pride and a sense of accomplishment until one remembers that just below the peak is a stone

marked with a bronze plaque. This marks the place where Fr Slavko, spiritual director to the visionaries died in 2000 after having completed the villagers. Many of the projects which make Medjugorje so special started with Fr Slavko, and his many books are another fruit of the apparitions.

More than 1 million people visit Medjugorje each year and it's estimated that more than 30 million have visited since the apparitions began. I have never prayed the rosary so often, and my eyes have never filled with tears so often as when we heard the stories of those touched by Our Lady's call. I am so glad that we said yes to Mary.

Regardless of the veracity, or otherwise, of the visions our pilgrimage brought us closer to Mary and through her to Christ. It has been said that "for those who believe, no proof is necessary. For those who don't believe, no proof is possible", this is especially true of Medjugorje. We discovered that there is nothing to be lost, and so much to be gained, in accepting the call of Our Lady.




