I GOT DRUNK, GOT ANGRY, SMASHED UP MY FRIEND'S HOUSE AND BROKE A WINDOW. HOW CAN I BE FORGIVEN AND PUT THINGS RIGHT?

While everyone seems pleased that the Archbishop has designated St Edmund's as a place where the Jubilee Indulgence may be obtained, I also picked up quite a bit of scepticism about indulgences. I am afraid living in (what was) a Protestant country we have often been subject to Martin Luther's criticism of them as attempts to buy forgiveness. Put simply he was wrong because he mixed up two things: forgiveness of the sin - in theological language "Justification" - and growing holy - Sanctification. Penance is often seen as a sort of punishment but it would be better seen as medicine for the soul to help it rid itself of sin. Of course medicine can be somewhat nasty, even if it is doing us good in the long run.

I can best explain this with a little story. One Saturday evening at a party at my friend's house I get blind drunk, trash the furniture and smash a window. The next morning I sober up and realise what I have done; I ask forgiveness of my friend and he forgives me. Relations are restored and we remain friends. (The friend in my story is God who is merciful and always forgives, we might be less perfect.) So I am forgiven, "justified", and do not suffer punishment - my friend could have called the police and have me sent to gaol. Hmm, I got off that. BUT, BUT.....if I am truly sorry I should repair the damage I caused, pay for the broken window, or otherwise compensate my friend. AND, AND I have a drink problem and an anger management problem. Both need dealing with or I will certainly commit other sins if I don't change. I need to grow holier.

I cannot do anything to earn God's grace and forgiveness, it is His gift to me. But I can co-operate with Him to become holier, I can take the medicine of penance. An indulgence can be considered a little boost to help us on the way, we are given a help from the "treasury of the satisfaction of Christ and the saints." Remember we are never alone.
