The Modern Roman Rite

- 3-year cycle of readings on Sundays: years A, B and C
- 2-year cycle on weekdays: years 1 and 2
- OT + Psalm + Epistle + Gospel at Mass (typically) on Sundays

- 89.8% of Gospels at Sunday and weekday Masses
- 25% of the epistles (letters)
- 13% of the Old Testament






