

COME HOLY SPIRIT!

In our Bibles John's gospel lies between Luke's and Acts, so it is easy to forget that they were written as a two-parter with Acts as the sequel. The opening words of both are very similar. Luke writes a forward dedicating both to the "most excellent Theophilus" Lk 1:3, Acts 1:1), telling him that he has done careful research so Theophilus "may know the truth concerning the things of which you have been informed" (Lk 1:4). Theophilus means "lover of God" and could be either an actual person or a literary device to stand for any Christian, or someone interested in learning about the faith, who wants to know the truth about Jesus.

There are other similarities and parallels if we look closer. Luke's gospel starts in a remote, peripheral part of the Holy Land, in Nazareth, and moves on to the centre of Jewish life and culture, Jerusalem, where we learn of the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ. Acts continues the story, starting in Jerusalem, in a remote obscure province of the Roman Empire and takes us to Rome itself, the beating heart of the world at that The progress of God's Kingdom is time. unstoppable! The role of the Holy Spirit in all of this is important for Luke. At the start of his gospel the Holy Ghost descends on Mary, (Lk 1:35) who humbly accepts God's invitation to be the mother of the Saviour and God enters the world in Christ's physical body, born of Mary. Moreover, Mary responds "in haste" (Lk 1:39) to take the Good News to St Elizabeth, who is her cousin and mother of John the Baptist.

At the start of Acts we find that Mary, the Apostles and disciples are all together (Acts 1:14, 2:1). The mystical body of Christ, the Church, is born when the Holy Ghost descends on them. The Apostles respond in faith by taking the Good News to the whole world. God is present in His church to those who have faith. The Church herself is the sacrament of God's presence in the world and Mary is both Mother of God and Mother of the Church (Vatican II, Lumen Gentium, chapter viii). And who makes up the Church, the people of God? We do!

As St. Paul tells us the mystical body of Christ, which was born at Pentecost, is made up of "one body but many members" (1 Corinthians 12:12). We have all received different gifts of the Spirit which we should contribute to the whole. At the first Pentecost the believers came from many different races and languages, but they were united in a Spirit of joy. This gift of languages restores things to the state they were in before the curse of the "confusion of languages" incurred after the building of the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1 -9). The Spirit makes us one, reminding us that Jesus prayed for unity among believers in last week's gospel.

Just as Mary and the Apostles responded to the outpouring of the Spirit on them, we need to make a response. What are the gifts of the Spirit that have been given to me, and how can I use them to the benefit of all? And how can I spread the joy of the gospel? Hint: "Preach the gospel at all times and if necessary, use words," (attributed to St Francis of Assisi).





CORRECTION

Last week we wrote about plans for the renovation of the Lady Chapel and stated that Deacon Ray is an architect. We need to clarify that Ray no longer works as an architect and is no longer on the register of architects. We apologise for any confusion caused. Ray will, however, be assisting in developing the plans for the Lady Chapel, with the help of any parishioners who would like to get involved.

YEW TREES

After expert advice, the two yew trees at the front of the church have been cut back and greatly reduced in size.

These trees were not part of the church when built but were clearly planted many years after. When they were put in they were located directly into the ground and unfortunately close to the front of the church. Over the years these trees have been allowed to grow noticeably out of shape, becoming very unbalanced and also travelling further towards the pavement and the street furniture. Reducing their size will allow the brickwork that had been behind the trees for a number of years to dry out and not be subject to moisture and water ingress. It will also mean that the roots are less likely to suck moisture out of the clay beneath and cause damage to the foundations

Yew trees are very hardy and new growth is visible already.

Next Saturday, the 24th May is the 75th anniversary of the consecration of our church. We are marking the occasion by a special Mass at 6.00 pm on that day which will be led by Bishop Paul Hendricks. Bishop Paul is a local lad, born in Beckenham before moving to Orpington where I was also brought up.

St Edmund's has always been a family church: many young people attending today are the grandchildren and even the great grandchildren of people who would have come to Mass here 75 years ago. To continue this connection with the past, alongside Bishop Paul, our organist today is Antony Sisley. Antony's grand-parents owned a sweet shop on the High Street where they made their own confectionary. Antony was baptised in our church, made his first communion here and his confirmation. He was also an altar server for many years and plays at many of our services.

In the years since our church's consecration much has changed in the world and in Beckenham too! Our congregation is now made up of people from every corner of our world and this has added a richness and diversity to all we do although there is much to be done to build on this.

This special Mass has been brought together in somewhat of a hurry as this year has been particularly pressured with archdiocesan initiatives, my health issues, and the sudden death of Fr Sunith in our neighbouring parish. 

WE NEED HELP

Our priests are finding it hard to prepare the church for Mass on weekday mornings. They start soon after 9.00 am to set up the altar, prepare the books and the vessels, and then three days a week lead the rosary, before celebrating Mass.

After Mass they remain in the church whilst Adoration is taking place and hear confessions. After reposing the Blessed Sacrament they then need to clear the altar, remove the books and wash the vessels that have been used.

In the past a small dedicated team of people have assisted in all of this.

Other people will have led the rosary and following Mass someone would have remained in the church whilst Adoration was taking place so the Blessed Sacrament was never left unattended.

The parishioners who did all this have assisted us for many years and now have reached the point when they are no longer able to help.

It has therefore fallen to our priests to do all these tasks themselves.

We need people to help prepare for each morning Mass. All the tasks can be itemised and what needs to be done will be shown to anyone who volunteers.

Individuals can sign up for a specified day each week. They can work with a friend or build a new team. They do not have to do it forever. They can step away at any point.

Morning Mass cannot continue without help. Please speak to one of the priests if you can assist.

NEWLY ENGAGED? PLANNING YOUR WEDDING?

If you intend getting married in a Catholic church anywhere in the world you will need to attend a Marriage Preparation Course, and also meet with one of the clergy team for your marriage paperwork to be completed.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE



One of the last acts of Pope Francis' papacy was to declare 2025 a worldwide Jubilee Year, with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Pilgrims may gain a Jubilee Plenary Indulgence by undertaking a pious pilgrimage (individually or in a group) to a sacred place; in Southwark Archdiocese

Archbishop John has designated 16 Jubilee Churches and Shrines. St Edmund's is honoured to have been declared one of these Jubilee Churches.

This is indeed a special year as we also celebrate the 75th anniversary of the consecration of our church building. You will see posters that have been placed around the church and prayer cards, that we encourage you to take away and use to pray particularly for our parish.

The prayer cards and posters feature a reference to the coat of arms of our patron saint, Edmund of Canterbury (who is depicted in stained glass on the right-hand side of the nave). These symbols are a scarlet cross and a red-billed chough, a type of crow with red beak and claws. Kentish legend says that when St Thomas a Becket was martyred in Canterbury Cathedral a crow dipped his feet



and beak in the martyr's blood and became a chough. The chough in flight represents the Gospel being carried out into the world. St Edmund was a great preacher and a champion for justice, standing up for the rights of the people, he seems to be a particularly appropriate saint for our times.

The reverse of the prayer card, and the posters, explain how a plenary indulgence may be gained. An indulgence is a gift of the Holy Spirit, by which our souls are cleansed of past sins, we are made new again.

Pope Francis called on us all to be Pilgrims of Hope this year. We welcome all pilgrims to St Edmunds on their spiritual and physical journeys; may our hope, born of faith, be a beacon for all in these difficult times.

THE INDUCTION LOOP SYSTEM HAS BEEN UPGRADED.

We are delighted to let you know that we are now fully compliant with the British Standards. This means that whatever volume level you set your hearing aid to in your normal day to day activity; you should be able to walk into our church, switch to your 'T'/Loop mode, and hear the service perfectly well.

There are many different types of hearing aids and not all have a Loop facility. However we have two important tips:

1 - Due to the nature in which a Loop system works, it is important to keep your head looking forwards. If you look down you will notice a drop in volume. Our Sound Engineer advises that if you concentrate on looking the Priest in the eye, your volume will remain constant.

2 – If your hearing aid is whistling, you are not in the Induction Loop mode.

It seems that we would not, for legal reasons, be able to issue permits for people to park on the yellow lines: to do that you need to be entitled to a blue badge. If you think you are eligible please do persist in following this option with your doctor so you can park for free, and where you are otherwise not able to do so.



CAR PARKING ON SUNDAYS

As I write this on Thursday evening, I have counted 17 emails I have sent today and yesterday dealing with this issue, so please understand that I am doing my best to find out what was agreed in 1979 when the archdiocese sold the land.

Bromley Council has, quite as I expected, claimed they have no record of protected free Sunday parking for parishioners and the onus is on us to prove our case. They have stated that if we cannot prove anything we will have to pay for parking like everyone else.

I have contacted the Council Parking Department and six individual councillors from the Beckenham Town and Kelsey wards. I do not want to be party political, but it is interesting that, whereas the Parking Department and the two opposition councillors have corresponded with me, the four from the party running the council have not even acknowledged my email, or deigned to reply.

A search through parish records and diocesan records has produced nothing relevant. I have therefore obtained documents from the land registry. These are not of the actual sale because, as many of you are aware, the land and the car park no longer belong to Sainsbury's itself. These documents have shown that we have rights of access to inspect, maintain and repair the church, tower and presbytery. **There is, however, no mention of parking rights**. If there had been any type of written statement about parking, unfortunately the Land Registry does not keep those sort of records from before 1986 or so.

There remains a slim chance of Archbishop's House finding something in old paper records, but the main grounds for hope are the advice I have been given - I am lucky that several parishioners with legal knowledge and experience are advising me - concerning the original planning permission in 1979. The permission may have been granted with quarantees to overcome the church's objections about parking. I have therefore asked the council to send me copies of the original papers from that time. I have also spoken to the manager at Sainsbury's, who is supportive. Finally, I should say that I am not entirely sure *exactly* what land was sold: I am told a house or houses, which were demolished, where the vehicular access to Sainsbury's now is. Certainly a narrow strip of land immediately next to the church and presbytery, essentially the path. Whilst people remember a car park, I am not sure how it was accessed, or even if it belonged to the archdiocese. If it did not, and what was sold was space for access rather than the land where Sainsbury's and the car park now stands, it would not be a surprise that we do not have parking rights as the land was not ours and the only hope would be from the planning permission documents. We will continue to pursue the issue and have discussions to see how we can best respond to the situation as a parish.

In the meantime please let me know if you have any written evidence, or other knowledge from that time that could be helpful, and please be careful next week. The council is apparently repainting yellow lines in Village Way and may be extending the extent of them and adding extra times in the evening when you cannot park.



CAR PARKING ON SUNDAYS

There are changes to the regulations governing the Sainsbury's car park. Parishioners who drive to Mass need to be aware of them.

From **1 April,** cars will be charged when using the car park after 7.30 am, seven days a week.

The hourly rate has inceased to $\pounds 1.00$ for up to one hour, $\pounds 1.80$ for up to two hours and $\pounds 2.60$ for up to three hours.....

Charges are collected by the RingGo app with its mandatory 'convenience' charge of 20p per transaction each time it is used.

UPDATE: Since last week I have been contacting councillors, Bromley Council and the Property and Archive people at Archbishop's House. On Tuesday I was copied into an email from Archbishop's House saying that documents from the file would be with someone by "the end of the day," and I was hopeful. Unfortunately, the archivist only works on Mondays and Tuesdays so we have to wait another week to see what they contain. I have asked to go and see what they say myself.

The wording is critical and would have to be legally binding as Bromley Council says that they have no record of any agreement with the church over parking, though they say they are "looking." The onus of proof is on us and I just have to see what our records say, before I can do anything else. The Council has said that if we prove our case there could be a permit scheme whereby we would have to register you to have a permit to display on your dashboard. However, they have said if we do not come with legally binding proof of an an agreement, "people will simply have to pay like everyone else". Fingers crossed that the archives contain sufficient proof.



CAR PARKING

There are changes to the regulations governing the Sainsbury's car park. Parishioners who drive to Mass need to be aware of them.

From **1 April**, cars will be charged when using the car park after 7.30 am, seven days a week.

The hourly rate has inceased to $\pounds 1.00$ for up to one hour, $\pounds 1.80$ for up to two hours and $\pounds 2.60$ for up to three hours.....

Charges are collected by the RingGo app with its mandatory 'convenience' charge of 20p per transaction each time it is used.

We are well aware that when land was sold to build the car park in Monsignor Strand's time, over 40 years ago, there was an agreement that parishioners would never have to pay to come to church on a Sunday. As the landowner was the *Archdiocese of Southwark*, not the parish, we have asked the diocesan department concerned to check their records to see what the conditions attached to the sale were, with a view to taking action.



AN INTERNATIONAL DIACONATE



Last week more than 2,500 permanent deacons gathered in Rome to celebrate the Jubilee of Deacons as part of the Jubilee year of hope which began on Christmas Eve. Over 100 nations were represented as we gathered in Rome on Friday 21st February, and many of us also attended a conference organised by the International Diaconate Centre at the beginning of that week. It was truly inspiring to meet people like Deacon Ivan from Bombay who runs a vibrant youth ministry in the Archdiocese; Deacon Tony, who with his wife Annette, established a parish from scratch in a new town outside Sydney without a parish

priest; and Deacon Peter from Rottenburg, who was born deaf mute and lost his sight later in life: he ministers to the deaf blind community, supported by his wife Margaretha, who signs onto his hand at high speed.

We each expressed our love of diaconal ministry and our hopes for the future in a series of talks, and conversations in the spirit. These conversations are at the heart of the synodal path, listening without judgement and speaking truthfully from the heart. There were both similarities and differences in our experiences but we shared a common bond through our ministry of service.

Then on Sunday 23rd we gathered as a diaconal community to celebrate Mass in St Peter's basilica and to celebrate the ordination of 23 men from around the world to the Permanent Diaconate. Sadly Pope Francis was unable to join us but his inspirational homily was read by Monsignor Fisichella.

Pope Francis talked of Deacons as being "sculptors" and "painters" of the merciful face of the Father, displaying selfless service which is an essential dimension of our ministry. He continued to say that Deacons are set apart from society by ordination, only to be re-immersed in it, in order to enable our Church to be ever more open and welcoming. This is the essence of the journey that Pope Francis has set us on, to become a synodal Church, that doesn't 'hide' within its places of worship but goes out into the world.

Forgiveness is one of the characteristics that Pope Francis has called for in the Deacons of the Church. In his homily the Pope explained how Jesus reminds us that "we need to be able to forgive and to ask forgiveness, to rebuild relationships and even to choose not to withhold our love from those who hurt or betray us".

In conclusion Pope Francis called for Deacons to be apostles of forgiveness, selfless servants of our brothers and sisters, and builders of communion, where all the popes of God participate in the Church's mission to bring Christ to all and all to Christ. Our mission is clear and daunting, we need more than the current 50,000 permanent deacons worldwide.

So, please pray for the Diaconal community and for vocations to the Permanent Diaconate; we have a lot of work to do! **Deacon Ray**

However, if you read closely, the Archbishop is asking us how, in really practical ways, we can improve things in our parishes, deaneries and diocese to become an evangelising church.

Merging of parishes is not the only theme by any means, and it is not for the very near future, but it is on the horizon, and your opinions will be noted on this and other issues.

You are free to form your own groups, to meet as you feel fit, and to return your answers by the 6th April in the ways outlined in the booklet, but we thought it would also be good to have several sessions in the hall to make it easy for people to come along.

Clergy are not allowed to take part in any of the groups as the Archbishop wants to hear what **you** think. These sessions will take place at 7.30 p.m. in the hall on Tuesday 4th and 11th of March and the 1st April (not a joke.)

You can decide whether you wish to complete your answers in two or three sessions. As was said above, if none of these times suits your group, you are free to organise your own meetings at a convenient time and place. Some of you might, for example, want to set up a Zoom discussion group.

IS CONFESSION ON YOUR RADAR?

Do you have questions about the Sacrament of Reconciliation? How often should you go? Is it mainly for Easter and Christmas? Do we have to go to Confession apart from serious sin? What are the spiritual benefits from regular Confession? How should we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation? What difference will it make to my life?

Our Lady at Medjugorje has said, "Monthly confession will be a remedy for the Church in the West. One must convey this message to the West. (August 6, 1982)

Confession engages us body, mind, spirit and emotions. It is holistic. It is one of the three healing sacraments with the Eucharist and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Most importantly our sins are completely forgiven through the ministry of the priest when the sacrament is approached with sincerity.

The priest stands in for the person of Christ - that is, in persona Christi. When we confess, we confess first and foremost to God whom we have offended. Then the priest - acting on the authority given to him by Christ through the Apostles - forgives us in the name of the Persons of the Blessed Trinity.

You can hear more about this wonderful sacrament and have your questions answered by Fr Damian Ilodigwe on Wednesday in the Hall following Holy Mass which he will be celebrating at 8.00 pm. The talk will begin at 9.00 pm. Fr Damian is a doctor of philosophy, seminary lecturer and author from Nigeria.

I GOT DRUNK, GOT ANGRY, SMASHED UP MY FRIEND'S HOUSE AND BROKE A WINDOW. HOW CAN I BE FORGIVEN AND PUT THINGS RIGHT?

While everyone seems pleased that the Archbishop has designated St Edmund's as a place where the Jubilee Indulgence may be obtained, I also picked up quite a bit of scepticism about indulgences. I am afraid living in (what was) a Protestant country we have often been subject to Martin Luther's criticism of them as attempts to buy forgiveness. Put simply he was wrong because he mixed up two things: forgiveness of the sin - in theological language "Justification" - and growing holy - Sanctification. Penance is often seen as a sort of punishment but it would be better seen as medicine for the soul to help it rid itself of sin. Of course medicine can be somewhat nasty, even if it is doing us good in the long run.

I can best explain this with a little story. One Saturday evening at a party at my friend's house I get blind drunk, trash the furniture and smash a window. The next morning I sober up and realise what I have done; I ask forgiveness of my friend and he forgives me. Relations are restored and we remain friends. (The friend in my story is God who is merciful and always forgives, we might be less perfect.) So I am forgiven, "justified", and do not suffer punishment - my friend could have called the police and have me sent to gaol. Hmm, I got off that. BUT, BUT.....if I am truly sorry I should repair the damage I caused, pay for the broken window, or otherwise compensate my friend. AND, AND I have a drink problem and an anger management problem. Both need dealing with or I will certainly commit other sins if I don't change. I need to grow holier.

I cannot do anything to earn God's grace and forgiveness, it is His gift to me. But I can co-operate with Him to become holier, I can take the medicine of penance. An indulgence can be considered a little boost to help us on the way, we are given a help from the "treasury of the satisfaction of Christ and the saints." Remember we are never alone.





JUST PRESS PLAY! - THE BIBLE IN A YEAR

Last December I wrote a piece for the newsletter, inviting fellow parishioners to consider a new year's resolution to become more familiar with the bible. I mentioned in particular the Bible in a Year podcast, led by Fr Mike Schmitz, a youngish and very enthusiastic American Catholic priest. Over 365 days he reads the entire 73 books of the Catholic bible with a prayer and a reflection on how the scripture relates to our lives today. The podcast varies from 15 to 25 minutes a day. This daily routine has had such a massive impact on my life of faith that I wanted to share my experience. I set up and lead a group of around 12 parishioners who meet fortnightly to discuss how what we have heard has 'spoken' to us. We discuss scripture and faith together and encourage and support each other. We are not all at the same point in the bible reading plan, some are almost 'finished', others are taking it more slowly - it doesn't matter.

Fr Mike is keen to emphasise 'transformation – not information transfer' and this has resonated strongly with me and the others in the group.

What we read from God's word has truly helped me to live out my faith and has given me a daily focus, rooted in God's word and the teaching of the Catholic Church.

The podcast is available free on Hallow app, Ascension app or on YouTube. You can also use the QR code on the flyers located on the notice board by the side entrance of the church.

My invitation to you is – just give the **Bible in a Year** a try. You have nothing to lose and so much to gain. 

ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL - ARCHBISHOP JOHN WILSON SPEAKS OUT

As the assisted suicide bill was published this week, our Archbishop John Wilson has urged people to act and raise their voices in opposition to the proposals.

Archbishop John said the threat is "not just physical but moral and spiritual too. We are duty bound to stand up and challenge this attack on human dignity on all fronts".

The Archbishop makes clear that if "we are true followers of Christ, we must do all we can to support and protect the most vulnerable in our society".

In his message, posted on YouTube and other social media channels, the Archbishop highlights the pressure the proposals will put people suffering illnesses or disabilities under. He said: "People are being presented as a problem. As a burden. A statistic. Something we can deal with through ending their life".

Archbishop John asks "where is the dignity in that? Where is the love in that?" Each person is made in the image and likeness of God. We are called, the Archbishop said, as followers of the Lord Jesus to "care for those who are suffering, not to bring about their death". Because, "who are we to say a life is not worth living or that someone is better off dead because society values their contribution less than someone else".

This is why, Archbishop John said, "we need to raise our voices to say that is not true". He urges everyone to "speak up", because "if we don't stand up and value the dignity of human life, who will?"

Because as Archbishop John said, "as followers of the Lord Jesus, we must be bold in our efforts to uphold, respect and protect every human life from conception until natural death".

So please show, that "you will not sit idly while the elderly and people with illnesses and disabilities are treated as nothing but a burden to society and their family".

Together, let's be clear all are made in the likeness and image of God. That they are loved.

THE LETTER - a Postcript

On 17th September St Edmund's hosted a successful screening of the documentary The Letter in the church hall as part of the Season of Creation. The film follows five people representing groups that are most affected by the climate crisis as they travel from their home countries to meet with Pope Francis in the Vatican to share their stories with him. The film was made in response to the papal encyclical (or 'letter' - hence the title) Laudato Si' (Praised Be) which was subsequently expanded upon in his exhortation Laudate Deum (Praise God). This film powerfully brings home the human scale consequences of climate change, which

THE ASSISTED DYING BILL

Last week Cardinal Vincent Nichols wrote a letter asking us to oppose this bill as our own Archbishop, John Wilson, did earlier in the year. As ever, the proponents of the bill use the language of "choice", "rights" and "dignity" to make the unacceptable appear acceptable. The Cardinal makes three points:

1. Be careful of what you wish for.

The experience of countries that have already introduced similar legislation, such as Canada and Belgium, shows that "The circumstances in which taking a life is permitted are widened and widened." The Catholic Herald recently reported that "In 2022 a 23-year-old woman opted, and was allowed, to be euthanized due to suffering PTSD following an ISIS terror attack in Brussels airport in 2016." It commented, "Does that sound like care for a terminally ill individual with a physical condition that is causing chronic pain?" As the Cardinal says, "It is a journey best not begun."

2. A "right" to die becomes a duty to die.

In these countries palliative care is becoming increasingly restricted and it is reasonable to expect the same would happen here. Ironically, this so called extension of choice would produce an intolerable situation where only the wealthiest would be able to afford the end of life care they need the Cardinal makes it clear that these days excellent pain relief is available - whilst our relationship with medical staff would be damaged for ever. Needless to say it is to be feared that people would be put under pressure "to do the right thing" by those seeking to receive their inheritance. It would be much better to keep things as they are and to improve palliative care.

3. Being forgetful of God belittles our humanity.

Our faith teaches that every human being - made in the image and likeness of God- has an inherent dignity and worth. Our humanity was embraced by Jesus Christ who "Brings our humanity to its full glory through the gateway of suffering and death." We understand that our life is a gift from God," Not our own possession to dispose of as we feel fit."

What can we do about this?

A debate and first vote are expected to take place in Parliament on November 29th. The Cardinal asks us to write to our MP, to have discussions with friends and colleagues, and above all to pray. You can also use the QR to take you to a website where you can express your disapproval.
