### **ALL SAINTS ALL SOULS**

These are usually celebrated on the first and second of November. I have lived in both France and Italy where All Saints Day is a public holiday and, even in this secular age, is well observed in French and Italian society, in the same way that 'cultural Christians' in this country celebrate Christmas and Easter and would pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. In fact, when I lived in France, I was surprised when a Jewish lady I knew said she would be visiting her Jewish relatives graves during the holiday. If you are in France at this time the florists will all be selling chrysanthemums, as this is the flower typically taken to the cemetery. Don't make the mistake of taking a bunch to give to your hostess at a dinner party though, as chrysanthemums flower of considered the death mourning. It would be a bit like taking her a wreath.

As people may only have the public holiday itself off work, the cemetery visits for All Souls that day are thus made a day earlier than they should be. The French and Italians have half an excuse in confusing the two celebrations due to the holiday, but many English Catholics do the same. On All Saints Day the liturgical colour is white as we celebrate not only all the canonised saints but also all those 'little people' who lived a hidden life of sanctity, but have never been formally recognised as saints. Pope Francis used to have a very apt phrase; 'the saints next door.' He meant not just those living literally next door, but those who live around us and whom we meet in our daily lives. Those who, quietly and without fuss, simply do the will of God.

On All Souls Day the priest wears purple or black- these colours are used for the Requiem Mass on Remembrance

Sunday as well - as we remember the Holy Souls in purgatory, those who have died in God's friendship but who have not yet progressed enough in sanctity to enter heaven straight away. The Bible tells us 'Nothing unclean will ever enter it' (heaven) Revelation 21:27. So on All Souls Day, and for the rest of November, the emphasis shifts to praying for the faithful departed. prayers and masses we offer for them help them to stay firm in their resolve to purify themselves, 'It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins.' 2 Maccabees 12:46. (Douay-Rheims.) This verse, from an Old Testament book set in the second century BC, shows that the Jews prayed for the dead. Martin Luther and other Protestants rejected the concept of praying for the dead and Catholic teaching on purgatory. They rejected 2 Maccabees and other books, e.g. Tobit, Wisdom, Baruch, that had always been in Christian Bibles. These were in the Septuagint translation of the Old Testament used by the early Christians, but Luther restricted the list of books of his Old Testament to a shorter list of books drawn up by Jewish rabbis after the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in AD 70. That is why Protestant Bibles have fewer books than Catholic and Greek Orthodox ones. Some Protestants will loudly insist there is no Biblical warrant for praying for the dead, but they are not using the same Old Testament as the first Christians! Catholic and Greek Orthodox Christians continue to pray for the faithful departed as they have always done, considering this to be a "Holy and wholesome thought."





### **EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS**

Fr Steve and the other clergy have asked me to write to you about becoming ministers of the eucharist. Technically lay people become "extraordinary" ministers of the eucharist. "Extraordinary" is "church jargon" contrasting with the "ordinary" ministers of Holy Communion who are the priests and deacons.

When they think of eucharistic ministers, people think about the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass, and we could indeed do with some more assistance at Mass, but there is another very important reason for asking. One of the roles of an extraordinary eucharistic minister is to take Communion to the sick. We simply no longer have enough priests and deacons to do this. And as a parish we have not been so good at this, especially since Covid, when people became reluctant to go into peoples' homes. It is a sad truth that some of our elderly have been somewhat neglected. am ashamed to say that people who have been faithful Catholics all their lives, even daily Mass goers, have sometimes slipped through the cracks. We are currently looking at our lists to update them as the first step towards improvement. We would ask anyone who has a friend, relative or neighbour who is in need of a visit or Holy Communion to contact the office - and with their consent give contact details. We are aiming for people to be visited on a more regular basis: they should see a priest regularly, though not every time. If lay ministers are able to take communion on the other occasions, we should be able to visit more people on a more regular basis and also make sure everyone has a chance to see a priest. If someone felt able to help with the admin and check that people are being visited regularly and on a fair basis, this would help too. Someone taking just an hour or so to check, once a fortnight, would be a great help. This job could be done by one of the eucharistic ministers or by someone who would not be comfortable with visiting people in their homes, but wishes to help alleviate this problem.

Of course, eucharistic ministers are needed to help with Mass but they can also, with permission, expose or repose the Blessed Sacrament. They are not allowed to do the blessing with the monstrance, as this is reserved to priests and deacons. However, even to enable simple exposition is a worth-while ministry: as the number of priests reduces this may be a great benefit to the community.

Eucharistic Ministers can also conduct eucharistic services when no priest is available. Now this is not to say that ALL eucharistic ministers must do this, most don't or wouldn't feel comfortable so doing, but it is just an indication of the importance of this ministry. Would-be ministers must, however undergo the usual safeguarding checks, due to their interactions with vulnerable adults, and the necessary training.

In the near future clergy will be asking people if they would like to consider undertaking this ministry. If you are asked, do give it your consideration.

### WHY CATHOLICS GO TO HOLY MASS

Holy Mass is a communal gathering where Catholics come together as a community of believers to worship and be united with God and with one another. It is considered the highest form of worship, and a way to give thanks and praise to God for all that he has done for us. It is also a central re-enactment of the last supper when Jesus was with his disciples, and a memorial of His sacrifice on the cross. During Holy Mass Catholics receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, which provides spiritual strength and grace.

Hence attending Mass is essential spiritual food, providing the necessary words and sacrament, to avoid spiritual weakness and emptiness. It is an opportunity for Catholics to be sorry for their sins and receive forgiveness from God.

Nowadays however, not many people take going to Mass seriously. Some people attend Mass online, even when they have no reason to. Others listen to Mass on radios and televisions. From the time COVID struck to now, Mass attendance the world over has declined. For instance, in our church the attendance has dropped from an average of 1035 pre covid to 653 in the count just carried out. It is worth noting that the normal way of attending Holy Mass is for the members of the Christian community to come together to the church or to a community as circumstances may allow and other ways are exceptional. (We do of course give thanks that our housebound parishioners are able to join with us each day on our live streamed Masses and receive communion at home thanks to our Eucharistic Ministers and the clergy team).

Let it be clear to us that if we miss going to Mass, we miss that aspect of "coming together as a community of believers" therefore our community life is weakened. We also miss receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, thereby missing the spiritual food, which cannot be received through attending Mass online or through other channels.

If there is not a compelling reason, let us not avoid coming to Mass in person, so that we can build our spiritual life and strengthen our community life too.

Could each one of us reach out to a friend who has not attended Mass for some good time, and in a loving way explain to the friend and encourage them to resume Mass attendance for their spiritual wellbeing and for the growth of the church.



### PEACE IN THE HOLY LAND?

A few weeks ago the Gospel reading at Sunday Mass included the parable of a man who, wanting to accommodate his bumper harvest, tore down his old barns and built bigger ones. He died before he could derive any benefit from them. The reading is from Luke's gospel (12: 13 - 21) and those of you who come to weekday Mass will have the opportunity of hearing it again in just over a week's time.

The story is so arresting that we tend to forget what made Jesus tell it: a man's request for Jesus' help in getting his hands on an inheritance that his brother had refused to pass on to him. For most of us, Jesus' reaction to the man is disconcerting, because he refuses to help. Instead, he warns the man not to be greedy. 'Don't strive to accumulate more than you need for life,' he says, 'what matters is your credit rating with your Father in heaven.' Whether or not we have personal experience of litigation over wills and inheritances, we will all know of such cases, and most of us will have some sympathy with the man that Jesus puts down so uncompromisingly. The thought of anyone being swindled makes us recoil with indignation as something deep within us kicks in; as Machiavelli observed: a man will sooner forget the death of his father than the loss of his inheritance.

As I write this, we are waiting to see if the plan to end the war in Gaza will stick. The root of the conflict is essentially the same as that of the man who sought Jesus' help - though multiplied enormously. Those of us who have happy childhood memories will sigh at the thought of the family home being sold after the death of our parents, but we get over it. However, when what is at stake is not the family home but the land of our birth, or the land of our parents and ancestors, it is a different matter, because that land is where our beliefs, culture and values were nurtured, the source from which we developed our sense of belonging, and of how we fit in on God's earth. Having to let go of it, or being forced out of it, can be an assault on our very identity. Palestinians, the Holy Land is theirs, as it had been for Until a hundred years ago it was overwhelmingly a land of Palestinians, and its expropriation in 1948, and their enforced removal from large parts of it, remains, for them, a catastrophe. For Jews, piecing together their sense of self-hood after the horrors their people underwent at the hands of the Nazis and their collaborators, the Holy Land holds a similar place: looking back over two thousand years, they also claim it as theirs. The dispute is not just about real estate and a source of livelihood, but about Palestinian and Jewish people's

sense of themselves, of who they are, of where they belong.

But when both sides claim the same land as being inalienably *theirs*, there can be only one outcome, as, for large numbers in both populations, mounting suspicion gives way to fear and hatred, before escalating, inevitably, into a total demonisation of the other side, until each camp even denies the basic human rights of the other, and seizes land, kidnaps and slaughters hostages, or bombs indiscriminately. And, all the while, nobody has achieved anything worth having.

For decades, masses of Palestinians have lived, been born, died, in poverty, in refugee camps, at first hoping for justice, but descending, as despair kicked in, into a craving for revenge. Zionists, with cruelty, violence, fire and bullets, continue to seize land from Palestinians and to build on it, having then to surround their settlements with razor wire to remain safe against reprisals. Can either side ever have a moment's real peace?

When Jesus advised that man over his inheritance dispute, he said nothing about seeking to be reconciled with his brother, and he refused, point blank, to intervene, not even in the interests of justice. Instead, he homed in on what he saw as the core of the matter, telling the man to guard against believing that possessions can make us happy. It's not an easy lesson for any of us. But suppose the man *did*, somehow, go on to seek justice, in the courts, say. Would peace result? A judge might assign him what was due to him; but the family would probably remain broken, perhaps forever, as both brothers continue to live out their resentment in the years ahead.

Maybe there is a lesson here as we consider the problem of justice in the Holy Land. Peace can only come when both sides back down from a belief that it's about winning and losing. Seventy years of conflict have shown the emptiness of that way of thinking. We must thank God that there have long been many, many people - Jews, Muslims, Christians, Palestinians, Israelis – living together in the Holy Land, who do want peace, who have always wanted peace. If the proposal for ceasing the war in Gaza can take hold, we can yet hope that the voices of these other people can be heard as the din of gunfire and bombing, and the wailing of the bereaved, and the groaning of the wounded and the destitute, gradually fade away.

"If we do not plan, we plan to fail". My words in last's week newsletter caused some comment and feedback so I am writing Part 2 to you sooner than I expected.

The issue of Supply Priests, which I wrote about last time is an immediate issue, but there is a background to this. In 'The Called to Bear Fruit' booklets we looked at a year ago, the Archbishop asked us to prepare for the future so we can ensure provision for the sacraments when we have fewer priests.

This is a practical issue, whatever your opinion on married priests and woman's ordination is. The Anglicans have both, but their clergy numbers are falling too: 47% of their stipendiary clergy will reach retirement age in the next 12 years and the current rate of ordinations will not replace them.

Things are far from hopeless as there is currently a incease in those discerning the priesthood. And we have help from religious orders like the Franciscans, Carmelites and Spiritans in many parishes of the diocese.

However, we have to plan for clergy retiring over the next few years. Last year the Bishop of Arundel and Brighton - our neighbour, of course - caused some shock when he said he intended to replace the existing 85 parishes with just 11 'Team Parishes'.

Fr Ashley told me in an email the other day that the first of these has now been set up, in

Brighton and Hove. Last October the Bishop of Lancaster told me, at the ordination of one of my colleagues from the Beda, that he was reducing the number of parishes in his diocese from around 90 down to 25 or so. We can't expect Beckenham to escape. It is useless to speculate on details - there is consultation with clergy in the near future to decide these - but generally it is clear that parishes are going to be merged and grouped together in a new way. I expect that there will still be more than one priest at St Edmund's but, rather than seeing them as St Edmund's priests exclusively, we need to understand they are priests for other local churches too as they may need to go there on a regular basis.

All of this means extra work for Fr Steve as the local Dean, but it does ensure that needs are met. In some ways it would be good for our over worked catechists and volunteers to do some things - confirmation? - on a deanery basis. Things will be *different* rather than worse, but if we plan, they can be good. These changes are likely to come into play over the next few years rather than immediately, but they are coming.



"If we do not plan, we plan fail." About twenty years ago I worked for a headteacher who would say this very often to students to encourage them to draw up a "revision plan" before their exams. I am sure, however, that it applies to many other things. We can never know what the future will hold. both good and bad, and there will always be surprises, but we can be prepared and so look forward without worry and anxiety. The Archbishop is asking us to prepare for the future at a deanery level, so we can weather the challenges that are coming. You will "Called Bear recall the to Fruit" booklets and consultation a little while back, and many of you were gracious enough to give your time to give your thoughts about the future.

August we were supposed to have a supply priest from Nigeria. He never arrived due to difficulties and delays obtaining a visa, as I understand it. This reflects a significant tightening due to the masses elsewhere. There is no need to present political climate. Since Brexit the visa regime applies equally to priests from the European Union who have to go but it seems to me that we have to keep through exactly the same process and you in the loop about what is going on. expense, whereas previously they didn't even need to apply for a visa and could help out here for the summer and improve their English at the same time. And there is the not so little issue of expense: to have a supply priest for just two months would have cost us over £3,000 for visa fees, air fares, etc. It is a burden small parishes cannot afford.

Given the twin problems of visas and the cost, the Archbishop has decided that vear the archdiocese will not next go down the route of trying to get short term supply priests to cover for priests' holidays. Quite simply weekday masses will need to be cancelled while the parish priest is away, and perhaps at weekends. While a priest is away, it may be that the number of masses will have to be temporarily reduced: if parish A and B **both** have a Saturday evening mass at 6 pm and are just a bus ride apart, it would seem logical, if the parish priest at church A is away, that his parishioners will have either to attend a Sunday mass at another time or go to church B for their usual 6 pm time slot. You might think that St Edmund's has a number of priests so that there will be no impact here, but this is not the case. As dean, Fr. Steve will You will also recall that in July and be spending quite a bit of time and effort organising the local clergy to coordinate when they go away so we can all manage, and it is likely that the priests at St Edmund's will have to cover Sunday panic, we just need to plan for the future. This might not seem so relevant to you,







### THE IMPORTANCE AND THE BENEFIT OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION IN OUR CHRISTIAN LIVES

The late and renowned priest of the Diocese of Rome, Father Gabriele Amorth, wrote some striking phrases related to Eucharistic Adoration. These words reveal the extraordinary power of being in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

Below, I share with you several of these phrases:

- "He is there, hidden in that white bread! But He is not hidden from us; we see Him, and His light burns us. It is like a fire that we cannot put out!"
- "That piece of bread is not just bread. It is He, the same one who threw us out of heaven!. We hate Him, but we cannot get close to Him!"
- "If humans knew who is really there, the whole world would kneel and we would be defeated forever!"
- "Every minute spent before Him takes away our strength. He forces us to flee like cowards!"
- "That place where they adore Him is full of angels. We cannot enter there even with our traps!"
- "When they worship Him, He strengthens their souls and destroys everything we have done in their lives."
- "One hour before Him takes away from us the souls we had trapped for years. It is like a great war against us, and we always lose it!"
- "The Holy Hour fills their homes and families with light. We cannot bear that light, it blinds us!"
- "When they do the Holy Hour for sinners, they receive His mercy and our chains are broken. It is a condemnation for us!"
- "Those hours of silence before Him are like a hammer hitting our heads. We cannot resist it!"
- "When they look at Him, they say nothing, but He acts in their hearts. It destroys us from within!"
- "Silence before Him is more powerful than a thousand words. He fills them with grace and makes them invincible!"
- "Every moment of adoration offered by the souls in purgatory frees them. Those acts are like swords that cut our chains!"
- "The souls He frees take away ground from us, and we cannot regain it!"
- "Stop those reparative worships! Every act before Him destroys what we have built with so much effort."

- "Reparative worship is poison for us. It is as if you destroy everything we do in your souls!"
- "When you make amends for blasphemies and sacrileges, you weaken us more than you can imagine."
- "Those who spend time before Him are protected! It is as if they build a barrier of fire around them. We cannot reach them easily!"
- "Every time one of you looks at Him with faith, we receive a punishment that hurts us more than a thousand chains."
- "When someone worships Him with all their heart, He snatches away what is ours. He humiliates us every time!"
- "Those prayers before the Blessed Sacrament for sinners are our ruin. They receive His mercy and repent, and that destroys our traps!"
- "When they pray for the lost before Him, He shows them His love and breaks our chains. It is a disaster for us!"
- "Adoration for sinners leaves us powerless over them. He covers them with His blood, and we can no longer touch them!"
- "It burns us, it burns us! That light that radiates from the Blessed Sacrament is like a fire that never goes out"
- "He is alive there, and we cannot bear it. His gaze destroys us."
- "The souls that consecrate themselves to Adoration are like swords that pierce us. We cannot overcome them!"
- "Those small groups that adore Him are more powerful than entire armies of our own."
- "One hour with Him is worth more than thousands of prayers that do not include His presence."
- "Ádoration of the Blessed Sacrament is like a rain that puts out the fires we have lit in the world."
- "These acts of worship bring peace to the earth.

If adoration of our Lord Jesus Christ in the most Holy Sacrament of the altar brings us such great benefits and protection from the devil, why don't we as members of this church community treasure, love and participate in it regularly as a way of saving our souls! Ponder about it,

### CHRIST'S TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS

It is often said that what we fear is not death, but dying, and it was no different for Jesus. The closer Jesus came to his own death, a death that he knew would be one of appalling, cruel torture, the more the horror of what he would have to undergo began to undermine his resolve.

It was while he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane that his agony truly began, culminating in the cry, 'May this cup be taken away from me!' He even knew that he had it in his power to escape from those who were on their way to arrest him. All it would take would be to do as his ancestor, King David, had done, many centuries earlier, when he had fled from Jerusalem to escape the army of his rebellious son, Absalom: to carry on up the Mount of Olives and escape from there into the seclusion and safety of the wilderness beyond.

So great was his consternation as he awaited his Father's answer that, as Luke tells us, Jesus sweated blood. This is a rare phenomenon, but it does sometimes happen – its technical name is 'haematohidrosis'. Around the sweat glands there are delicate networks of very fine blood vessels, and under the pressure of great stress these blood vessels constrict. Then, as the anxiety passes, the blood vessels dilate and rupture, the blood passes into the sweat glands, and out through the skin. We should notice that detail: the blood is squeezed out *once the anxiety has passed*. With his Father's help in response to his prayer, by the time he is sweating blood Jesus has already *triumphed* over his fear of what will befall him: his agony has passed because he has completely accepted his Father's will. This is the beginning of Christ's triumph, and it is surely a source of deep consolation to us to know that, in his love for us, and for his Father, he went willingly, and with total readiness, to his death, enduring his final hours of insult, humiliation and pain in a state of utter inner peace. There, in the Garden of Gethsemane, the battle had already been won.

Children must not be allowed to run around in the church. This is a safety issue in a crowded church and is completely unacceptable. Children should sit with their parent at all times.

Whether you're a Bible In a Year finalist, just beginning your faith journey, or somewhere in between, you'll find listening to others is as valued as sharing your (often) newly discovered insight or revelation.

Come as you are. Share what you're discovering or simply be present. Whether that be wishing to start your own Bible journey, the 'Rosary In a Year', or if you've found your way to other writers such as C.S Lewis, you'll find a space where people support each other, ask honest questions, and explore faith in real, personal ways. We've found this group to be a great place to grow, learn, and deepen our spiritual lives.

Some of our members wish to share their personal testimonies:

I found Bible In a Year a really great experience, Fr Mike and Jeff Cavins have a really clear way to explain the true meaning behind some of the more difficult Bible passages. It was half an hour each day well spent and a great opportunity to do something I would never have done without this podcast."

I have learnt so much about God's nature, that He wills to love us, and redeem us over and over until time itself comes to an end

I see Faith Explorers as a support group which continues to evolve as we learn more and spread our net wider into theological works. How we each approach this has been fascinating and interesting; it is a great place to ask questions and get some answers. For me, I wanted to read

the Bible properly and to start to understand it. What a brilliant podcast series it has been. There are lots of follow-on materials I am finding. It is no exaggeration to say the process has been life changing for me. Thank you."

Come and try us - see if we're right for you. Faith is a journey, and you don't have to walk it alone, and you can walk it at your pace (not just in a year).

"(Bible In a year) Can answer many questions, even some on University Challenge!"

We meet on average every two weeks, usually in the meeting room in the church hall. We will be meeting again after our summer break, on 5 September.

It is very straightforward. The Office needs to know the name of the person you wish to be prayed for - just their name will do - or you can give a brief reason why prayers are being requested. You can ask for a weekday Mass or a Sunday Mass, but it helps if you are not date and time specific, unless the date is important (anniversary or birthday) in which case it is necessary to contact the Office well in advance.

A Mass offering (stipend) is always offered when a Mass is requested. The diocese suggests a **minimum** of £10.00.

Requests can be made to the Office, by email, or by a note through the letter box, and payment can be made by ChurchSuite Donate or cheque or cash.

We will take requests at the door but prefer to receive them in writing, particularly if you are submitting a number of requests.

## **COME HOLY SPIRIT!**

In our Bibles John's gospel lies between Luke's and Acts, so it is easy to forget that they were written as a two-parter with Acts as the sequel. The opening words of both are very similar. Luke writes a forward dedicating both to the "most excellent Theophilus" Lk 1:3, Acts 1:1), telling him that he has done careful research so Theophilus "may know the truth concerning the things of which you have been informed" (Lk 1:4). Theophilus means "lover of God" and could be either an actual person or a literary device to stand for any Christian, or someone interested in learning about the faith, who wants to know the truth about Jesus.

There are other similarities and parallels if we look closer. Luke's gospel starts in a remote, peripheral part of the Holy Land, in Nazareth, and moves on to the centre of Jewish life and culture, Jerusalem, where we learn of the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ. continues the story, starting Jerusalem, in a remote obscure province of the Roman Empire and takes us to Rome itself, the beating heart of the world at that The progress of God's Kingdom is unstoppable! The role of the Holy Spirit in all of this is important for Luke. At the start of his gospel the Holy Ghost descends on Mary, (Lk 1:35) who humbly accepts God's invitation to be the mother of the Saviour and God enters the world in Christ's physical body, born of Mary. Moreover, Mary responds "in haste" (Lk 1:39) to take the Good News to St Elizabeth, who is her cousin and mother of John the Baptist.

At the start of Acts we find that Mary, the Apostles and disciples are all together (Acts 1:14, 2:1). The mystical body of Christ, the Church, is born when the Holy Ghost

descends on them. The Apostles respond in faith by taking the Good News to the whole world. God is present in His church to those who have faith. The Church herself is the sacrament of God's presence in the world and Mary is both Mother of God and Mother of the Church (Vatican II, Lumen Gentium, chapter viii). And who makes up the Church, the people of God? We do!

As St. Paul tells us the mystical body of Christ, which was born at Pentecost, is made up of "one body but many members" (1 Corinthians 12:12). We have all received different gifts of the Spirit which we should contribute to the whole. At the first Pentecost the believers came from many different races and languages, but they were united in a Spirit of joy. This gift of languages restores things to the state they were in before the curse of the "confusion of languages" incurred after the building of the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1 -9). The Spirit makes us one, reminding us that Jesus prayed for unity among believers in last week's gospel.

Just as Mary and the Apostles responded to the outpouring of the Spirit on them, we need to make a response. What are the gifts of the Spirit that have been given to me, and how can I use them to the benefit of all? And how can I spread the joy of the gospel? Hint: "Preach the gospel at all times and if necessary, use words," (attributed to St Francis of Assisi).

### CORRECTION

Last week we wrote about plans for the renovation of the Lady Chapel and stated that Deacon Ray is an architect. We need to clarify that Ray no longer works as an architect and is no longer on the register of architects. We apologise for any confusion caused. Ray will, however, be assisting in developing the plans for the Lady Chapel, with the help of any parishioners who would like to get involved.

### YEW TREES

After expert advice, the two yew trees at the front of the church have been cut back and greatly reduced in size.

These trees were not part of the church when built but were clearly planted many years after. When they were put in they were located directly into the ground and unfortunately close to the front of the church. Over the years these trees have been allowed to grow noticeably out of shape, becoming very unbalanced and also travelling further towards the pavement and the street furniture. Reducing their size will allow the brickwork that had been behind the trees for a number of years to dry out and not be subject to moisture and water ingress. It will also mean that the roots are less likely to suck moisture out of the clay beneath and cause damage to the foundations

Yew trees are very hardy and new growth is visible already.

## ST EDMUND'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY 24 MAY 2025

Next Saturday, the 24th May is the 75th anniversary of the consecration of our church. We are marking the occasion by a special Mass at 6.00 pm on that day which will be led by Bishop Paul Hendricks. Bishop Paul is a local lad, born in Beckenham before moving to Orpington where I was also brought up.

St Edmund's has always been a family church: many young people attending today are the grandchildren and even the great grandchildren of people who would have come to Mass here 75 years ago. To continue this connection with the past, alongside Bishop Paul, our organist today is Antony Sisley. Antony's grand-parents owned a sweet shop on the High Street where they made their own confectionary. Antony was baptised in our church, made his first communion here and his confirmation. He was also an altar server for many years and plays at many of our services.

In the years since our church's consecration much has changed in the world and in Beckenham too! Our congregation is now made up of people from every corner of our world and this has added a richness and diversity to all we do although there is much to be done to build on this.

This special Mass has been brought together in somewhat of a hurry as this year has been particularly pressured with archdiocesan initiatives, my health issues, and the sudden death of Fr Sunith in our neighbouring parish. As Dean of Bromley I have had to spend considerable time assisting St Anthony' over this very difficult period for them and we now have loaned our own Fr John to them.

We have given thought to how we can make a lasting memorial to this anniversary and decided we would like to renovate our Lady Chapel to make it a more welcoming, prayerful and comfortable space. Deacon Ray, who is an architect will spearhead this and we will show any plans to you when they are ready.

To help fund this project I have decided that the second collection at all Masses this weekend will go towards the Lady Chapel Fund.

I have commissioned some beautiful hand poured candles as a memento of this day. I am delighted to say that they have been made for us by a young man who also received all his sacraments at St Edmund's, and his schooling at St Mary's. All the profits from the sale of these candles will go to the Lady Chapel fund.

## **WE NEED HELP**

In the past a small dedicated team of people have assisted in all of this.

Other people will have led the rosary and following Mass someone would have remained in the church whilst Adoration was taking place so the Blessed Sacrament was never left unattended.

The parishioners who did all this have assisted us for many years and now have reached the point when they are no longer able to help.

It has therefore fallen to our priests to do all these tasks themselves.

We need people to help prepare for each morning Mass. All the tasks can be itemised and what needs to be done will be shown to anyone who volunteers.

Individuals can sign up for a specified day each week. They can work with a friend or build a new team. They do not have to do it forever. They can step away at any point.

Morning Mass cannot continue without help. Please speak to one of the priests if you can assist.

### **PILGRIMS OF HOPE**



One of the last acts of Pope Francis' papacy was to declare 2025 a worldwide Jubilee Year, with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Pilgrims may gain a Jubilee Plenary Indulgence by undertaking a pious pilgrimage (individually or in a group) to a sacred place; in Southwark Archdiocese

Archbishop John has designated 16 Jubilee Churches and Shrines. St Edmund's is honoured to have been declared one of these Jubilee Churches.

This is indeed a special year as we also celebrate the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the consecration of our church building. You will see posters that have been placed around the church and prayer cards, that we encourage you to take away and use to pray particularly for our parish.

The prayer cards and posters feature a reference to the coat of arms of our patron saint, Edmund of Canterbury (who is depicted in stained glass on the right-hand side of the nave). These symbols are a scarlet cross and a red-billed chough, a type of crow with red beak and claws. Kentish legend says that when St Thomas a Becket was martyred in Canterbury Cathedral a crow dipped his feet

and beak in the martyr's blood and became a chough. The chough in flight represents the Gospel being carried out into the world. St Edmund was a great preacher and a champion for justice, standing up for the rights of the people, he seems to be a particularly appropriate saint for our times.

The reverse of the prayer card, and the posters, explain how a plenary indulgence may be gained. An indulgence is a gift of the Holy Spirit, by which our souls are cleansed of past sins, we are made new again.

Pope Francis called on us all to be Pilgrims of Hope this year. We welcome all pilgrims to St Edmunds on their spiritual and physical journeys; may our hope, born of faith, be a beacon for all in these difficult times.

## THE INDUCTION LOOP SYSTEM HAS BEEN UPGRADED.

We are delighted to let you know that we are now fully compliant with the British Standards. This means that whatever volume level you set your hearing aid to in your normal day to day activity; you should be able to walk into our church, switch to your 'T'/Loop mode, and hear the service perfectly well.

There are many different types of hearing aids and not all have a Loop facility. However we have two important tips:

1 - Due to the nature in which a Loop system works, it is important to keep your head looking forwards. If you look down you will notice a drop in volume. Our Sound Engineer advises that if you concentrate on looking the Priest in the eye, your volume will remain constant.

2 – If your hearing aid is whistling, you are not in the Induction Loop mode.

# INVITATION TO TAKE PART IN A SPIRITUAL PILGRIMAGE TO PENTECOST

This begins the Sunday after Easter, with daily Scripture reflections in a specially written course booklet, six weekly filmed talks pre-recorded at diocesan Jubilee shrines and churches and concludes with the closing Mass at the Jubilee Celebration Day at Aylesford Priory on Pentecost Saturday, 7 June. The evening will finish with refreshments at 9.30 pm.

### SAINSBURY'S CAR PARK

The Sainsbury's car park will continue on a paying basis on Good Friday, Holy Saturday, Easter Sunday and Easter Monday (a bank holiday). I objected to this when I met Councillors Harris and Tickner on Wednesday, since Easter Sunday remains a day on which shops cannot open. Apparently Christmas Day will be free, the one day of the year!

On a more positive note I have asked the Council to come and check the yellow lines and notices outside the church and hall, so that people can be safely dropped off, perhaps with a marked bay to do so. I have also reminded them of the need to accommodate funeral corteges and wedding cars.

It seems that we would not, for legal reasons, be able to issue permits for people to park on the yellow lines: to do that you need to be entitled to a blue badge. If you think you are eligible please do persist in following this option with your doctor so you can park for free, and where you are otherwise not able to do so.
