### **HONESTY BEFORE GOD AND MAN GIVES US PEACE AND HAPPINESS**

Dear friends in Christ,

When I visited one of the shopping centres in town this week, a gentleman came into the shop where I had gone to buy some small item, picked up some valuable, put it into his pocket and smartly walked out of the shop without paying! This shocked me and it made me recall this story of a very honest widow in Uganda which I will now share with you.

A shopkeeper had just opened his store when a woman arrived and said, "Sir, here is your 1,000 shillings."

The shopkeeper looked at the poor woman with questioning eyes, as if asking, "When did I give you 1,000 shillings?" The woman replied, "Last evening, I bought some items. I gave you 10,000 shillings, bought goods worth 7,000 and you returned 4,000 instead of 3,000."

The shopkeeper touched the 1,000 to his forehead, placed it in the cash box, and asked, "Tell me one thing, sister. You bargained so much while buying the items, even for 500 shillings and now you've come all the way to return 1,000?!"

The woman replied, "Bargaining is my right. But once the price settled, paying less

The Shopkeeper said, "But you didn't pay less. You paid the full amount. This 1,000 came to you by my mistake. If you had kept it, it wouldn't have made any difference to me."

The Woman said, "It may not matter to you, but it would weigh on my conscience. I would know I kept your money knowingly. That's why I came last night to return it, but your shop was closed.'

The Shopkeeper asked in surprise, "Where do you live?" She replied, "Road 8."

The Shopkeeper's mouth dropped open. "You came 3 kilometers just to return 1,000 shillings and this is your second visit?!!!"

The Woman calmly said, "Yes, it's my second visit. If you want peace of mind, you have to do such things. My husband is no longer in this world, but he taught me one thing: 'Never take even a single coin that belongs to someone else because a person may stay silent, but the One above can ask for an account anytime. And the punishment for that account might fall on my children."

Saying this, the woman left.

The Shopkeeper immediately took out 30,000 shillings from the cash box, got on his bike, and told his assistant, "Take care of the shop. I'll be back soon."

He went to another shop in the market and handed 30,000 shillings to the shopkeeper named Prince "Here, take your 30,000. Yesterday, when you came to buy goods, I overcharged you."

Prince laughed and said, "If you overcharged me, you could've returned it when I came back. Why come so early in the morning?"

The shopkeeper replied, "What if I die before you return? You didn't even know I owed you 30,000 shillings. That's why I

had to return it. Who knows when the One above will ask for an account? And the punishment might fall on my children.' The shopkeeper left, but Prince was deeply disturbed. Ten years before, he had borrowed 3,000,000, (three million) shillings from a friend. But the very next day, the friend passed away.

The friend's family didn't know about the money, so no one asked for it. Prince, tempted by greed, never took the initiative to return it.

Today, that friend's family lives in poverty. His widow worked as a maid to raise her children. Yet Prince had kept their money.

The shopkeeper's words - "Who knows when the One above will ask for an account, and the punishment might fall on my children"-haunted Prince.

After three days of mental turmoil, his conscience awakened. He withdrew 30,000,000 shillings (30 million) from the bank and went to his friend's house.

The widow was at home, sitting with her children. Prince fell at her feet. For a woman struggling for every coin, 30,000,000 was a huge amount. Tears welled up in her eyes. She blessed Prince for his honesty.

She is the same woman who had gone twice to return 1,000/ shillings to the shopkeeper.

From the story above we learn that honesty makes us live in peace with God and with one another. As we prepare for the celebration of Christmas, may we be honest with God in all our dealings, aware that He knows us through and through, and that we shall account to Him for our actions. May we always treat one another with love, honesty, sincerity and trust. Let our conscience always be our judges.
