FROM ZEBRA CROSSINGS TO REFORMING THE IMMIGRATION SYSTEM

Last Thursday I had an interesting chat over coffee with Peter Brierley, Assistant Director of Citizens UK and Lead Organiser of London Citizens. Founded in 1989 Citizens UK claim to be 'the UK's biggest, most diverse and most effective people powered alliance' campaigning for numerous and various causes such as zebra crossings on dangerous roads, a decent living wage and reforming the immigration system. To date, they have 600 organisations involved and 4,000 community leaders trained in building a better and fairer society. Since its foundation hundreds of campaigns have been won, a success rate they hope will continue. You may be interested to know that the very basis and core of Citizens UK are Catholic Social Teaching principles. Recently before Christmas members of the organisation met with Pope Leo in Rome. Later this month or in March I hope Peter will come and speak at the Sunday Masses. I will keep you posted. – Father Steve

The **St Edmund's Bereavement Support Group** is a kind, safe, and understanding space for those grieving. In a warm and welcoming environment, parishioners can meet others experiencing loss, share their feelings, and talk about practical challenges that can feel overwhelming. There is no pressure to speak – simply being among others can bring reassurance. For those who wish to share, there is always a listening ear. This supportive group is open to all, regardless of faith. We run three groups a year, meeting weekly for six weeks. A lovely quality of this group is the genuine friendship and mutual support that often grows among those who come together through shared loss.
