ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT AND MORNING ROSARY – NEW ARRANGEMENTS

During Lent the Church invites us to re-examine the place of prayer in our lives. Many people pray the Rosary as a way of bringing themselves into that contemplative and humble frame of mind where God can reveal himself; others have different ways of opening themselves to his healing and sustaining power. There is, however, one devotion that many of us seldom avail ourselves of: sitting before Our Lord, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, whether in repose in the tabernacle or during our almost-daily periods of Adoration in the Church. There on the altar, or in the tabernacle, Jesus is truly present to us as though he were sitting beside us. What better source of grace could we hope for than this, what better way of placing ourselves before him?

For many years at St Edmund's we have prayed in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament after Mass every day of the week except Sundays. However, the numbers choosing to do so, or who are able to do so, have dwindled over the years, and now we find, as the priest or deacon comes to repose the Sacrament once more in the tabernacle, there is often hardly anyone present. For that reason, we have decided to change the timetable for Adoration in the hope that more people will be able to spend time before the Sacrament.

New times for Adoration and Rosary

These times will come into effect from Monday 2nd March.

From Monday to Thursday and on Saturday, the Sacrament will be exposed from 9am to 9:45 am. This will enable people to come for as short or as long a time as they wish before Mass.

On Mondays the Communal Recitation of the Rosary will take place after Mass.

During Lent, there will be no Rosary after Mass on Wednesdays as we will be having Stations of the Cross then. Wednesday Rosary after Mass will be introduced after Easter.

Because of the special nature of Fridays, the pattern for that day will remain as at present, with Rosary before Mass and Adoration following Mass from about 10:45 am. This will enable those who wish to spend a full hour in Adoration to do so.

To visit the Blessed Sacrament is . . . a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord (Pope St Paul VI, Mysterium Fidei, 66).

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER – Friday 6 MARCH



Please join us for this year's World Day of Prayer, to be held on at 11.30 am on Friday, 6 March at St Mary's, Shortlands. The theme is *"I will give you rest, come"*, with readings and music written by an ecumenical group of Christian women from Nigeria.

Our Nigerian sisters call us to come closer to God and find rest in him. The service shares the stories of four Nigerian women who inspire us to work towards a world without injustice, poverty, marginalisation and persecution.

The annual, women-led World Day of Prayer unites Christian congregations in 146 countries in a great wave of prayer in native languages. The sponsoring country changes each year, as does its theme, but it always starts near the international date line in Samoa, rolls around the globe, then finishes in American Samoa 38 hours later.

The service lasts about an hour, and a light lunch will follow. Please put 6 March in your diary and come along to meet men and women from churches across Beckenham.
