This week there will be Lectio Divina after Holy Mass with a focus on Easter.

Pope Frances described Lectio Divina like this. "*There is one way of listening to what the Lord wishes to tell us in his word and of letting ourselves be transformed by the Spirit. It is called Lectio Divina. It consists of reading God's word in a moment of prayer and allowing it to enlighten and renew us.*" (Evangelii Gaudium.)

The passage is read three times with a pause for prayer and reflection after each reading.

Meditatio. We reflect and ponder on the reading.

Oratio. We respond with our heart.

Contemplatio. We rest and wait for God to speak to us.

Do come and try it, especially if you have never experienced Lectio Divina before.

Christ centred community, through humble witness, love,
compassion and communion.

For Young Adults - Tenebrae

'Spy Wednesday', 1 April at 7.00 pm

Tenebrae, meaning "darkness", is the Church's ancient, candlelit office of Holy Week, in which psalms and readings lead us into the shadow of the Lord's Passion.

At St George's Cathedral the Cathedral Lay Clerks will sing this solemn office in traditional chant and polyphony composed by Victoria.

Confessions will be available, and there will be social time afterwards for young adults aged 18 to 35.
